When Communicating to a Popular Sanguine:

Give attention Communicate acceptance & approval Share your stories and experiences

Learning Style:

Break up assignments Provide group activities Incorporate activities and sensory stimulation

When Communicating to a Perfect Melancholy

Be sensitive to their feelings Respect their time, silence, and space Provide details and depth

Learning Style:

Appreciates structure and clear detailed directions Enjoys a clean uncluttered work space Likes to finish one large project before starting another one

When Communicating to a Powerful Choleric

Be brief, direct, and to the point Show appreciation for their accomplishments Provide choices and options

Will work hard for praise and recognition Energized by goals Avoid power struggles

When Communicating to a Peaceful Phlegmatic

Be respectful and appreciative of who they are Ask questions to draw out their thoughts and feelings Keep conflicts and disagreements to a minimum

Limit the choices and give smaller assignments Gently encourage their involvement Allow time to work at a slow and steady pace
